Maths

Volume and Capacity:

 Measure, compare, add and subtract volume/capacity (I / ml)

Multiplication and Division

- Divide and multiply by 10.
- Count from zero in multiples of 3,4,8,50 and 100
- Represent multiplication and division facts as arrays using a grid and a number-line
- Understand the links within and between tables facts

Geometry

- Sort and classify 2-D and 3-D shapes using numbers of faces, edges and vertices.
- Know the names of common 3-D shapes
- Construct prisms and describe the shape of the faces.
